DO YOU HAVE AN EXPIRED BUILDING PERMIT?

The City of Nelson Building Department is reminding homeowners who have obtained Building Permits for new construction or renovations to existing structures that a **final inspection is required before the permit can be closed**. If you have an open and expired building permit, you may receive a letter from the City that you are required to close the permit, or you may be contacted by telephone to arrange for a final inspection.

Building Permits expire after two (2) years. Contact the City of Nelson Building Department at 250-352-8260 if you think you have an open and expired Building Permit or if you have received a letter. Homeowners should be aware that having an open and expired building permit on your property may affect your ability to obtain house insurance or sell your property.



OPERATIONS

STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning is currently underway, and City crews are out scraping, sweeping and flushing streets to remove winter sand, improve road safety for cyclists, reduce dust and keep sediment out of our stormwater system and waterways.

Parking restrictions are in effect to facilitate effective and efficient cleanup. In certain areas, flyers and signage will notify residents about upcoming work and provide detailed information on parking restrictions. Residents with off-street parking are asked to park vehicles off the road during cleanup. If you don't have off-street parking, please follow the odd/even parking rule within residential areas, by parking your vehicle on the odd-numbered side of the street on odd-numbered dates, and the even-numbered side of the street on even-numbered dates. Please note, vehicles that do not follow the odd/even rule may be ticketed and towed.

If your home is adjacent to a boulevard, please rake the sand onto the street beside the curb (but not into a pile). A big thank you to all residents who do this year after year!

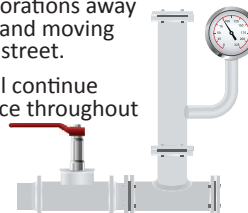
WATER MAIN UPGRADE – UPHILL

City crews will be upgrading 1930's and 40's era water main along the 1100 blocks of Ward and Josephine and 500 block of Observatory. The project is expected to begin near the end of May and extend into August. This work, originally identified in the City of Nelson's 2007 Water Masterplan will improve fire flows in the area and provide security of supply by looping the watermain.

Homes within the construction area will be notified individually as the crews prepare to arrive.

Residents can get ready by removing personal landscaping features or decorations away from water shut-off valves, and moving trailers and vehicles off the street.

Residents in these areas will continue have water and sewer service throughout the project, with some interruptions as new connections are made.

It's FireSmart Yard Clean-Up

***Free yard waste drop-off for the month of May at the Grohman Transfer Station**

***Burning Period Approved April 12th – May 20th**

Residents are advised to remove woody debris, bushes and long grasses from around homes, as well as to clean out eaves troughs. Embers from wildfires can travel up to 2 kms and start homes on fire, so no matter where you live in Nelson, your home could be at risk.

The best way to rid these fire fuels is to take them to the Grohman Transfer Station for free in the month of May! There is an approved burn period from April 12 - May 20, for woody debris, which is clean, dry, untreated wood resulting from residential yard clean up.

To apply for permit to burn, please bring proof of fire insurance plus \$10 cash/cheque to the Nelson Fire Hall.
